




Our Board of Directors and General Members meetings went very well. Look for the meeting minutes to be published in an upcoming Dashpot.



Navy Munitions Command Pacific East Asia Division Unit Guam

Assistant Mine Production Officer/ QA Leading Petty Officer

A Native of Wilmington, North Carolina. Petty Officer Lafave graduated from John T. Hoggard in 2012 and enlisted in the United States Navy in November 2013. He completed basic training at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, Illinois, followed by Mineman "A" School in Point Loma, CA.

Petty Officer Lafave's first tour was on USS Dextrous in Bahrain, where he served from March 2016 to April 2018 and quickly made the rank of Second Class Petty Officer. During his tour, he qualified as Combat Information Center Watch Officer. He was the ship's primary SAR swimmer, CICWS, Helmsman, SRF-A Team Leader, Snoopie Team Leader, Work Center Supervisor, Duty Armorer, OOD In-Port, Combat Training Team, Medical Training Team, CIC LPO as a third class, Shipping Officer, and went underway on two Patrol Coastal ships to fill

their SAR Swimmer requirement. Not only did he fill a gap on the PCs, he also got qualified in their watch stations to enhance the unit. He made and briefed the OPS/INTEL regularly while underway as he earned the trust to do so from the OPSO and CICO.

MNI LaFave's second tour of duty was at Mobile Dive and Salvage Unit II from June 2018 to June 2021. During this time he achieved the rank of First Class Petty Officer. While onboard, he served as Unmanned Underwater Vehicle Supervisor, Mission Planning Team

Leader, Post Mission Analysis Supervisor, Small boat Coxswain, WCS, Line Coach, COO, and ACDO. During his time at MDSU II he deployed to Bahrain, Germany, and Denmark. In November 2020, he reported to USS CHIEF (MCM-14) in Sasebo, Japan. 

MN1 RANDY ALLSTOT (NR NMCPAC MAU GM)









Biography

MN1 Allstot was born in Mountain View, California, on April 14, 1971. In 1981, he moved with his family to Waxahachie, TX, where he lived until he graduated from Waxahachie High School in 1989. In October 2001, MN1 Allstot enlisted in the Navy Reserve. After completing Recruit Training at Great Lakes, Petty Officer Allott was assigned to NR MOMAU 9 at NAS JRB Ft Worth. and completed MN "A" School in Ingleside, TX. In 2009, he advanced to Petty Officer 1st Class and became the LPO for MOMAU 9 until 2014 when he transferred to IRR. MN1 Allstot reenlisted in the Navy Reserve in 2018 and was assigned to the LCS ASW Fort Worth unit and was the Assistant LPO for a 55-member unit. He returned to MOMAU 9 in 2020 and was immediately installed as the LPO for the unit. MN1 Allstot has been awarded Two Navy Achievement Medals, 4 Good Conduct Medals, The Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Overseas Service Ribbon, the National Defense Service Medal, the Rifle Marksmanship Ribbon and the Expert Pistol Medal. In his civilian life, MN1 Allstot is a police officer for the DeSoto Police Department where he remained until 2018. Then he transferred to the Midlothian Police Department where he currently works. In April 2020, MN1 Allstot was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in his civilian job and transferred to the patrol division. In 2021 MN1 Allstot enrolled in college at University of Arizona Global Campus completing 29 hours toward his Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice. He lives in Midlothian, TX, with his wife Erin and his step-son Caden.





EXPLOSION AT ROMANIAN TOURIST RESORT WAS RUSSIAN SEA MINE THAT DRIFTED FROM UKRAINE WAR: REPORTS



An explosion rocked a popular Romanian tourist seaside resort on Monday morning, the blast at the sea wall sending a plume of water into the air, and local reports state it is believed to have been a sea mine detonating.

Local media described the blast as having taken place around 9AM in the morning, only a few dozen yards from the nearest hotel in Costinești, Romania. The resort is the busiest on Romania's Black Sea coast <u>says</u> <u>ProTV</u>, which interviewed a local who said the blast threw rocks high into the air, and reported that the explosion was loud enough to cause pain in the ears for some.

There were no hospitalisations, however, which is being treated with relief in Romanian media given what a busy resort Costineşti is at this time of year.

A lifeguard who witnessed the blast said: "I didn't imagine it could be so strong, because we've never seen anything like this before. The earth shook. At first, when I heard the thud and thick smoke, I thought a gas tank at the hotel had exploded. Everyone was scared, no one knew what happened."

A response including the emergency services and a naval minesweeper ship and a military helicopter were deployed to the blast area. Popular Romanian-focus news site HotNews reports divers were seen off the coast

Romanian news reports say the present working hypothesis is that the blast was caused by a Russian naval mine that became untethered from its intended position in the Black Sea as part of Russia's blockade of Ukraine. Free to drift, the mine made its way down-coast until it hit the sea wall at Costinești and exploded, creating a massive noise and sending a plume of water high into the air.

Romanian naval forces command said in a statement Monday evening that they had searched the coast and found no

Assuming the working theory is correct, this would not be not the first time sea mines have drifted into Romanian waters from the Ukraine war. Others were detected as they drifted by Romania's navy and safely detonated away from people, ProTV reports. Romania's navy is on particularly high alert as Tuesday is national Navy Day, an annual holiday to honour the force

While the stray mine may amount to an unwanted but perhaps not unexpected overspill from a neighbouring state resisting occupation, Russia has still shown a willingness to launch military strikes right up to Romania's border recently. Since Ukraine switched part of its grain exports from Black Sea ports to Danube ports which touch Romania's border on that border — Russia has launched strikes on those facilities as part of its blockade. The strikes coming down were so close to Romania — a NATO member state — Romanian military forces are reported to have watched them coming down from their posts.



About COMOMAG

The creation of MOMAG was directed by Commander Mine Warfare Forces on 15 October 1973 as a result of the highly successful use of Mobile Mines Assembly Teams (MOMAT's) in the early 1970's. Teams were previously chartered in both the Atlantic and Pacific regions to augment naval weapons departments around the globe with mine assembly and maintenance. With an increased emphasis on Mine Warfare Readiness, the Navy created COMOMAG to manage all aspects of the worldwide stockpile of naval mines. COMOMAG initially operated from its headquarters in Charleston, South Carolina. A number of smaller detachments and two larger Units were established around the world for on-site mine assembly and maintenance. These small detachments worked well, but to improve command and control of these activities, most MOMAG detachments were permanently converted to Mobile Mine Assembly Units (MOMAU) with a Commanding Officer to keep personnel and expertise on-station and in theater for full tours of duty. This process expanded opportunities for personnel to Permanent Change of Station (PCS) with their families and the readiness of all mine systems increased dramatically with the full time presence and dedicated expertise of Minemen for longer periods. Following the 1990 Gulf War and subsequent Base Realignment Commission recommendations, COMOMAG moved its headquarters in July 1994 to Corpus Christi, Texas to collocate with COMINEWARCOM and the MCM Squadrons, who preceded it in 1993 to the South Coastal Bend region of Texas. From a high of 14 MOMAG Units and Detachments, mining continued to evolve and consolidate its organization to a leaner, but capable structure of six permanently located MOMAU's around the globe. COMOMAG organization continues to be the U.S. Navy's sole mining resource and with both an offensive and defensive capability, is universally recognized as the "war" in Mine Warfare.


Commander, Navy Munitions Command (NMC) Division COMO-MAG realigned under the newly formed Navy Munitions Command on 1 October 2006. Creating a new Mining Division responsible for maintaining and assembling the U.S. Navy mine stockpile. The six remaining Mine Activities subsequently disestablished, and consolidated with respective Navy Munitions Command Division Units collocated in Misawa Japan, Okinawa Japan, and Guam, under Commander, Navy Munitions Command-Pacific East Asia Division (NMCPACEAD); Seal Beach, California under Commander, Navy Munitions Command-Pacific, CONUS West Division; and Charleston South Carolina under Commander, Navy Munitions Command-Atlantic (NMCLANT).

COMOMAG has been at its present location at Naval Station Point Loma in San Diego California since July 2010 due to 2009 Base Realignment of Mine Warfare Commands from South Texas to Southern California. Commander, Mobile Mine Assembly Group was realigned on 31 October 2011 as Commanding Officer, Mobile Mine Assembly Group. COMOMAG maintains oversight and provides subject matter expertise for mining programs for the Commander, Submarine Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet.
