Meeting Minutes

The Board of Directors met on 16 August, F.C. (Foxy) Fisher presiding. As a result of the BOD meeting, the following actions were taken:

- Bulk mailing/tax exempt discussions shelved until after election of new officers. (More info on this later).
- Fifteen (15) Fifth Wheels were made available by Jack Smoot, Vice President. Decision was made to award one each to the following members: Oldest Mineman Present; Youngest Mineman present; Mineman traveling the furthest distance and outgoing officers.

 The Annual General Business Meeting was held on 16 August 1980 at the FRA Branch 172 at 1300, President F.C. (FOXY) Fisher presiding. The

following actions were taken by the general membership:

- Membership Committee report made by Toby Horn. Mineman of the Year Award explained. Additional nominations for Honorary Mineman were submitted. The following were approved as Honorary Minemen: RADM A.J. Monger, USN (RET)-previous COMINEWARCOM; RADM C.F. Horne III, USN-current COMINEWARCOM; Mr. Haines Miller-first Technical Director (TD) of the Naval Mine Engineering Facility (NMEF); Mr. T. B. McConnell -current NMEF TD; and LCDR Arnold S. Lott, USN (RET)-author of Most Dangerous Sea.
 - Current committees as appointed would stand for the next year, 1981.
- Two new committees established each with five members and are Rules and Awards.
- In conjunction with Commander Mine Warfare Command (COMINEWARCOM) a Mineman of the Year Award program was established.
 - Nominations for Honorary Mineman Awards were submitted.
- Reunion Committee recommended annual meetings alternate between Yorktown and Charleston until there is sufficient interest and support to have it somewhere else.
- The establishment of a Ladies Auxiliary was discussed and strongly supported.

- The recommendation to allow for proxy voting was not approved.

- The office of Past President and the terms of office for Association Officers were discussed. The Rules Committee will review the current situation and make appropriate recommendations to the BOD as part of their review of the Constitution and By-Laws.

- All Association members are welcome to attend BOD meetings, however, unless a BOD member or Committee Chairman/Representative they cannot partic-

ipate, unless previously approved by the BOD.

- Reunion Committee met after the General meeting. Decision made and approved by the BOD to hold the 1981 Annual Meeting in Charleston S.C. Subsequently, dates of 14-15 and 16 August 1981 submitted and approved. Annual Meeting in 1982 will be held in Yorktown, VA. with subsequent Annual Meetings to alternate between Charleston S.C. and Yorktown, VA. until sufficient interest and support allow us to consider holding the meetings somewhere else.

- Patriots Point Committee reported receiving considerable amount of obsolete and excess mine material from the Fleet and Minewarfare Training Center, as authorized by Naval Sea Systems Command. The mines that were on display all around the hangar deck on the USS Yorktown have been gathered together in one area adjacent to the Smokey Stover Theatre, which is to your immediate right when you board the ship across the elevator. A berthing compartment has been made available to the Association and is being prepared as a storeroom and workshop.

- The Nominating Committee report was presented by John Loonam. There were no inputs from the committee members. A slate of nominations that had been prepared with the assistance of COMOMAG personnel was submitted. The committee was disestablished due to no requirements for elections next year (1981). Nominations from the floor were solicited and accepted.

- Election of Officers: The offices of President, Vice President and three Board of Directors were up for election. Result of the election as follows: President Lyal Stryker; Vice President Harry Coker; BOD Toby Horn, Jack Smoot and Phil Dechene. Continuing BOD members are Bob Forbes and Charlie Hunt.
- Rules Committee Members: Frank McCarthy, Chairman, Gordon Webster, R.H.Blankenship, Herb Fairbanks and Fred Reid.

- Awards Committee Members: Jim Coffman, Chairman, Earl Oldenburg,

Ted Newton, Milton Baird and Fred Bergey.

- Ladies Auxiliary: Needs and purpose discussed. Establishment unanimously approved. Matter was discussed with ladies at picnic and more info later.




